## Characteristics of the Security Paper for Health Certificates Issued by DIGECIPOA/SENACSA

Cream-colored sheets, made from opaque security paper without fluorescence, with a weight of 90 grams/m<sup>2</sup>. The paper contains a bitonal (light-dark) watermark embedded in its structure, featuring designs and texts that ensure legibility on both sides of the sheet. It includes the design of the “Official Coat of Arms of Paraguay” and the word “PARAGUAY,” both visible to the naked eye when held against the light, distributed in a multidirectional format across the entire sheet.

The paper includes colored visible fibers and invisible fibers that react under ultraviolet (UV) light, embedded within the paper mass. It is treated to resist chemical agents. Sheet size is Legal (21.5 cm x 33.0 cm). Full-color (CMYK) printing is used for the logos of the Institution and the National Government in the header (on the front of the sheet). The Institution's logo is printed on both sides using ultraviolet (UV) security ink that fluoresces green.

It has a security background with micro-patterns containing the inscription “SERVICIONACIONALDECALIDADYSALUDANIMAL” not visible to the naked eye. These personalized micro-patterns must not be transferable or reproducible via photocopying and/or scanning.

Designs of the National Coat of Arms and the Institution’s logo are printed with security ink that reacts to contact with metals. A reactive treatment area (security zone) of 1 cm x 5 cm is included in the bottom right corner on the front and the bottom left corner on the back of the sheet. This area allows the document to be validated by applying a verification brush, which produces a permanent reddish reaction that can be reversed with another brush that neutralizes the initial reaction. The sheet also features guilloche-style security designs.
